News Highlights

CSX Index

On 3rd December 2025, the CSX index by 0.20%, closing at 418.93 points. Most stocks on the Main Board showed mixed performance. ABC and GTI each edged up by 0.28%, PAS rose 0.96%, PPAP increased 0.14%, and PPSP gained 0.48%. In contrast, PEPC dropped 1.07%, PWSA declined 0.32%, and CGSM fell 0.79%. MJQE remained unchanged. On the Growth Board, DBDE rose by 0.93%, while JSL decreased by 1.13%. The total trading volume for the day reached 125,621 shares, with a trading value of KHR 777 million.

Economic and Business News

Major US companies evince keen interest in expanding investment in Cambodia

Prime Minister Hun Manet met with a delegation of leading US firms led by Ted Osius, highlighting Cambodia's rising profile as an "ASEAN rising star." The US companies reaffirmed their commitment to expand investments and explore new opportunities in healthcare, tourism, digital technology, finance, infrastructure, smart cities, and automotive sectors. Officials praised Cambodia's investor-friendly policies, transparency, and the Government-Private Sector Forum. Deputy Prime Minister Sun Chanthol emphasised reforms under the new Investment Law and digitalisation efforts. Bilateral trade reached \$10.7 billion, up 27% from 2024, while experts noted a shift toward high-tech and strategic investments, requiring enhanced local capacity. (Khmer Times)

SNIF allocates over \$29M to boost infra development

The Sub-National Administration Investment Fund (SNIF) allocated \$29.4 million to 141 municipalities and districts across Cambodia to support essential infrastructure projects, including roads, bridges, drainage systems, parks, solar street lighting, and water canals. The budget combines \$13.5 million from the state and \$15.9 million from the ADB as incentives for high-performing local administrations. Chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Aun Pornmoniroth, the SNIF meeting reviewed past achievements, approved 2026 performance guidelines, and proposed expanding the Fund to commune administrations to strengthen governance and local development. Kingdom, Zimbabwe explore trade, investment cooperation

The Cambodia Chamber of Commerce (CCC) and the Zimbabwean Embassy held talks to strengthen trade and investment cooperation. CCC Vice-President Lim Heng and Zimbabwean Ambassador Constance Chemwayi discussed signing a memorandum of understanding between their chambers to enhance economic ties. Chemwayi invited the CCC to attend a trade exhibition in Zimbabwe in April 2026 and encouraged Zimbabwean businesses to explore opportunities in Cambodia. Both sides identified agriculture, mining, and tourism as key sectors for collaboration, aiming to expand bilateral economic and investment relations. (Khmer Times)
