# **News Highlights**

## **CSX Index**

On 9th December 2025, the CSX index rose by 0.01%, closing at 419.80 points. Most stocks on the Main Board showed mixed performance. MJQE, PEPC, and PPAP increased by 0.50%, 3.72%, and 1.13% respectively, while ABC, GTI, PAS, and PWSA decreased by 0.27%, 0.28%, 0.15%, and 0.31%. CGSM and PPSP were unchanged. On the Growth Board, DBDE decreased by 0.92%, whereas JSL rose by 0.39%. The total trading volume for the day reached 84,760 shares, with a trading value of KHR 517 million.

#### Cambodia counts on visa-free scheme to boost Chinese tourism

Cambodia has launched a pilot visa-exemption scheme for Chinese nationals from June 15 to October 15, 2026, allowing 14-day stays without fees to boost tourism and strengthen ties with China. Announced during a major Cambodia- $China\,cultural\,festival\,in\,Siem\,Reap,\,the\,initiative\,is\,supported\,by\,upgraded\,tourism$ services and coordinated efforts with the Chinese Embassy and private sector. Experts say the move will attract more Chinese visitors and benefit the economy, with officials expecting 2026 to be a pivotal year for tourism recovery. (Khmer Times)

# Cambodia launches \$240M project to boost climate-resilient agriculture in 4 provinces

Cambodia's Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology (MOWRAM) launched the \$240 million CAISAR Project on December 8, 2025, to strengthen climate resilience, modernise irrigation, and improve rural livelihoods in Kandal, Kampong Speu, Kampong Chhnang, and Pursat provinces. Running from 2025 to 2030, the project will benefit about 562,000 residents through climate-smart agriculture, upgraded water infrastructure, and strengthened disaster preparedness. Funded by AIIB, IFAD, and GCF, CAISAR also focuses on building institutional capacity for sustainable water management, aiming to enhance food security, boost rural incomes, and support resilient communities with technical support from development partners. # Single portal registers business worth \$21B

Cambodia's Online Business Registration (OBR) portal has registered 52,498 businesses with \$21 billion in capital as of November 2025, reflecting strong private sector confidence and the government's success in simplifying administrative procedures through digital technology. Key sectors include restaurants, mobile food services, wholesale, household equipment sales, and construction, with women owning 36 percent of registered businesses. Launched in phases since 2020, the OBR system now offers 33 public services from 21 ministries, aiming to streamline operations, reduce costs, and foster a more transparent and investment-friendly business environment.
