CSX Index

On 13th February 2026, the CSX index increased by 0.04%, closing at 424.21 points. The main board was stable. CGSM, GTI, MJQE, PPAP, PPSP and PWSA all remained constant. ABC and PAS increased by 0.28% and 0.31% respectively. While PEPC decreased by 3.78%. On the growth board however, DBDE and PCG both decreased by 0.47% and 0.84%, while JSL remained constant. The day closed with a total trading volume of 76,095 and a total trading value of 364,443,760 KHR.

Cambodia reaffirms commitment with UNESCO on international law and multilateralism to protect national heritage

Suos Yara reaffirmed Cambodia's commitment to working with UNESCO through international law and multilateral cooperation to protect the country's cultural heritage, particularly amid past disputes with neighboring countries over heritage sites. During a meeting at the National Assembly with Flavio Bonetti, Yara emphasized that Cambodia's heritage protection efforts are grounded in international conventions and framed cultural heritage as a "bridge for peace" rather than a source of competition. Marking the 75th anniversary of Cambodia's UNESCO membership, he highlighted it as an opportunity to showcase the nation's conservation achievements and reaffirm ownership of registered heritage properties. Yara also proposed a "Digital Museum" initiative to enhance Asia-Europe digital connectivity and promote authentic Khmer cultural history, while encouraging stronger regional cultural cooperation through parliamentary mechanisms. Bonetti welcomed Cambodia's commitment and pledged continued technical support in cultural preservation and information policy. *(KhmerTimes)*

Environmental Engineering Key to Sustainable Development, Says Academy Official

At a seminar at the Royal Academy of Cambodia, Secretary-General Yang Peou said environmental engineering is vital for public health, food security and sustainable development amid climate change and pollution challenges. Key research topics included wastewater treatment using phytoplankton, arsenic removal from groundwater, pesticide residue analysis, and converting coffee waste into soil-enhancing humic acid—supporting circular economy and "One Health" principles. The event, organized by the Institute of Biology, Medicine and Agriculture, gathered academics and students to promote practical, science-based solutions for a greener Cambodia. *(KhmerTimes)*
