CSX Index

On 18th February 2026, the CSX index decreased by 0.09%, closing at 425.62 points. The main board that was decrease are ABC, GTI, PEPC and PPSP by 0.27%, 0.48%, 0.72% and 0.48% respectively. On the other hand, PWSA increase by 0.31%. while CGSM, MJQE, PAS and PPAP remain the same. On the growth board DBDE, JSL and PCG all decrease by 0.47%, 0.84% and 0.42% respectively. The day closed with a total trading volume of 81,474 and a total trading value of 411,685,810 KHR.

MoC explores digital trade and AI partnerships at Saudi training

A delegation from the Ministry of Commerce, led by Secretary of State Chea Rathda, participated in a high-level training program in Saudi Arabia from February 9–12, 2026, focused on leveraging Artificial Intelligence for socio-economic development and trade facilitation in Least Developed Countries (LDCs). The initiative, titled 'AI for Impact,' aimed to strengthen the policy and regulatory capacity of senior officials to ensure responsible AI governance while exploring practical applications in public administration and innovation. On the sidelines, the Cambodian delegation engaged in bilateral discussions with the UN Technology Bank and the King Abdullah University of Science and Technology (KAUST) to foster future cooperation in advancing Cambodia's digital trade and AI infrastructure. *(Khmer Times)*

Siem Reap partners with Dubai-based interests to court Middle Eastern tourists and investors

Siem Reap is pivotally shifting its tourism strategy to target the Middle East by partnering with Dubai-based interests to attract high-spending travelers and billionaire investors. During a recent meeting between Deputy Governor Ngov Sengkak and Dubai Amirakle Tour, the provincial administration outlined a new luxury-focused model tailored to Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) nationals that prioritizes premium, bespoke experiences alongside environmental preservation. This strategic corridor aims not only to showcase the cultural grandeur of Angkor Wat but also to channel Middle Eastern capital into Cambodian infrastructure and hospitality, ultimately serving as a catalyst for national economic growth and job creation. *(Khmer Times)*
